Eligibility: In order to be eligible to apply, a nominee must be the primary unpaid caregiver for a family member or loved one who experiences Alzheimer's Disease or other forms of dementia and requires in-home care.

Nominations: You may nominate yourself or someone you know. So, if you know a Caregiver who is selfless, dedicated, passionate, diligent, brave, creative, or ceaselessly optimistic (it could even be you!), please take the time to nominate that person for this year's award. There is no better way to show someone that you care and appreciate them. To nominate a caregiver, simply complete the application below and provide a brief description of why you or another special caregiver deserves this award.

Applications for the Caregiver award are due by November 27, 2023: The Alznet grant committee will review all applications and make its recommendation to the Alznet Board who will choose the two lucky award winners.
